

Resolution on Breast Cancer Prevention Amendments

Whereas, Breast cancer is a health concern for all Utahans, particularly for the adult female population; and

Whereas, Many women experience dense breast tissue; and

Whereas, Mammograms used to diagnose breast cancer are not as diagnostic with dense breast tissue; and

Whereas, Recent research has demonstrated that an ultrasound exam in addition to a mammogram is diagnostic of breast cancer with clients with dense breast tissue; and

Whereas, The facilities that perform mammograms may inform a client who has dense breast tissue and recommend they receive supplemental screening of dense breast tissue; therefore, be it

Resolved, That, Women's State Legislative Council supports legislation, when mammogram results include a client with dense breast tissue, the reporting facilities and health care provider may inform the client of this condition and recommend additional diagnostic testing dependent on risk factors and personal health history.

Resolution on Alcoholic Beverage Control Act Sampling Amendments

Whereas, The previous policy accommodating wine tasting by potential buyers originally took place in Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control (DABC) stores; and

Whereas, Potential restaurant wine purchasers have concluded this policy is too restrictive and costly for them; and

Whereas, Wine distributors have indicated a willingness to bring the wine to be tasted to the restaurants and abide by any mandated requirements related to this service; and

Whereas, Restaurateurs have indicated they will comply with proposed regulations supporting the change from wine tasting in DABC stores to their place of business, therefore, be it

Resolved, That, Women's State Legislative Council supports legislation in compliance to the proposed restriction and regulations for onsite wine tasting with cooperating restaurants.
